The students interacted quite well with the staff and some of the student queries included the following points:

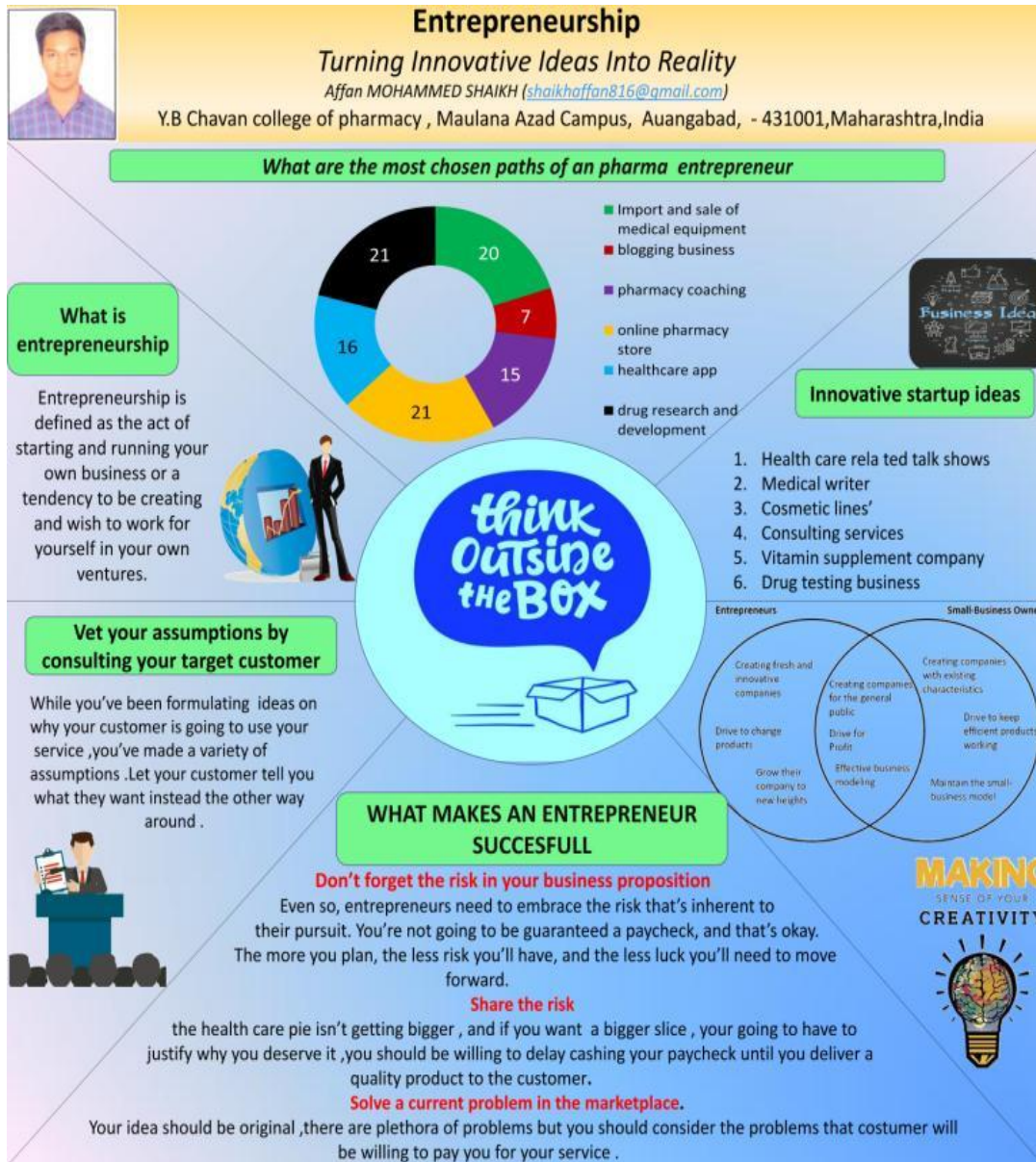
- How to plan for start-ups
