#### Industry Institute Interactions Cell Reports Successful Training and Placement for 2019

The Industry Institute Interactions Cell has released its annual report for the year 2019, highlighting training and placement activities.

The report details the training of students in various pharmaceutical industries, community pharmacies, research laboratories, and hospitals. A total of 12 organizations, including Wockhardt Limited, Adora Pharmaceuticals Ltd., Ajanta Pharmaceuticals, and Lupin Limited, provided training opportunities for the students.

The students also received training at Ipca Laboratories, Concept Pharmaceuticals, Redcross Formulation, Kapoor Herbal Products, Nagina Herbal, Sydler Remedies, Atra Pharmaceuticals, and through Hospital Pharmacist Training. The training involved a total of 56 students, with each organization training between 2 to 9 students.

Students were successfully placed in various pharmaceutical industries and hospitals. A total of 14 organizations, including TCS Limited, Aculife Healthcare Pvt Ltd,

Bharat Serum and Vaccines, GeBBs Health Care Solution Pvt Limited, Aurangabad, and Wockhardt Limited, conducted campus interviews.

The placements offered various posts such as Trainee Business Process Services, Territory Sales Executive, Area Sales Executive, Medical Coder, Officer DRA Dept, Apprentice Training, Ouality Control. Pharmacist. Research Associate. and Teaching. The average CTC ranged from Rs. 120,000 to Rs. 400,008.

The total campus placement for M.Pharm was 37 and 38 from B.Pharm respectively. The report underscores the successful efforts of the Industry Institute Interactions Cell in providing valuable training and placement opportunities for its students.







